He has worked extensively alongside the Indian Army, Paramilitary Forces, and disaster-response units across high-altitude regions including Kedarnath, Badrinath, Amarnath, Kailash, and the Himalayan frontier areas. Through these efforts, he has contributed to medical care, rescue operations, and humanitarian support for civilians and uniformed personnel in environments where conventional healthcare systems cannot operate.

Dr. Pradeep Bhardwaj is the Founder and Group CEO of Six Sigma Healthcare, an organization known for its work in high-altitude medicine, emergency response, and healthcare leadership. His initiatives have supported large-scale rescue missions, disaster relief operations, and specialized medical training programmes in collaboration with defence and civil authorities. He has also played a key role in training doctors and personnel in mountain medicine, rescue protocols, and extreme-environment healthcare.

Academically, he has held faculty and leadership roles across premier institutions in India and abroad and has authored and contributed to several publications focused on healthcare, leadership, and military–civil medical collaboration. His work has been acknowledged through multiple national and international recognitions, including commendations from senior leadership of the Indian Armed Forces.
